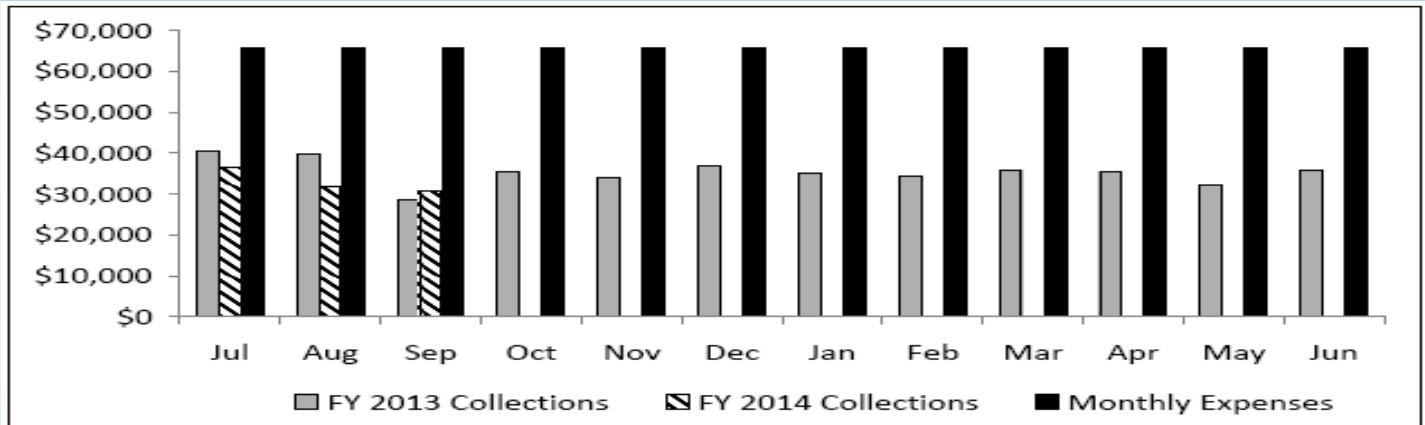

Fiscal Year (07/01 - 06/30) Comparison



- The collection for last weekend, September 21-22, 2013, was \$5,108.
- For the 2014 Fiscal Year, Sunday and Holy Day collections are down 14.4% from the 2013 Fiscal Year; versus expenses, we have a \$63,602 deficit.
- For the 2014 fiscal year, the cost per family per week is \$36 as 430 families contribute to the Parish.
- Our goal is to fund all operations and expenses from the weekly collections, i.e. the goal is for the striped bars to exceed the black bars in the chart above.
- St. Teresa's annual fundraisers assist in meeting funding gaps. It is the Finance Council's and Fr. Frank's goal to increase weekly giving to meet our ongoing expenses, and use the proceeds from fundraisers to fund special initiatives and outreach programs of the Parish.

Seek Virtue

In today's first reading, Amos condemns a self-absorbed people and their morally corrupt behavior and attitudes, which he warns will bring devastation. In the Gospel, the wealthy man is not given a name; he is simply the epitome of greed and irresponsibility. His lack of caring has created a gulf between him and the beggar Lazarus that not even Abraham can bridge.

In his letter to Timothy, a young bishop in the small Resurrection community of Ephesus, Paul exhorts this leader to seek virtues such as integrity, faith, and steadfastness with great gentleness. Paul also asks Timothy to keep in mind the future life with God who "dwells in unapproachable light." This is the blessedness of all those who, like Lazarus, were once poor but who are now rich. 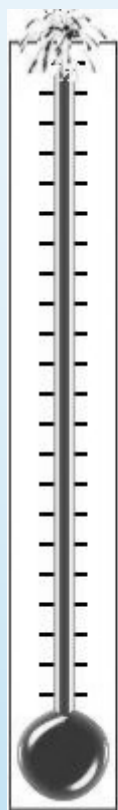

Building Faith Together \$68,412 Ahead of Goal...

We've exceeded our pledge goal of \$1,260,000. As of last weekend our pledged total went up to \$1,328,412, which is \$68,412 over our pledge goal.

Even though we have reached our goal, we are still taking pledges to cover any unanticipated costs in fees, demolition of the old school and convent buildings, or the renovation of the church. Pledge cards are available on the tables at the back of church and in the gathering space.

I pray that everyone will rejoice in the graces and hard work of so many of our fellow parishioners and make a meaningful gift that will lead us through a successful effort.

We have formally entered the collection phase of our campaign and have collected \$264,000 of donations pledged so far. There is a graph depicting pledges collected in the church, which we will update in \$88,000 increments.

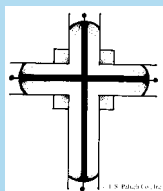

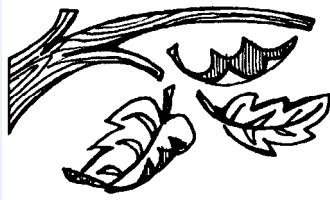

Reflecting on God's Word

If anyone is the prophet of the punch line, it is Amos. He travels up from the south to preach to the people of the northern kingdom of Israel and he pulls no punches. "Woe to the complacent," he begins, and then in a quick series of brush strokes lets them know how God sees them: lying upon their beds, stretched out on their couches, eating their tender lamb and calves, drinking fine wine while the music plays and they anoint themselves with the best oils. Then the punch line—they shall be the first to go into exile. The party is over!



In a similar vein Jesus paints a portrait of "Richman"—tradition has named him *Dives* (Latin for "rich man")—dressed in the best, eating the best, insulated in his own little world, while at his door Lazarus lies starving, with only dogs coming to lick his sores. It is a scene of total indifference to the plight of the poor. God's response is clear. The wheel will turn. And when it does, so shall Lazarus and Richman. What was a gap between them becomes a chasm.

The Letter to Timothy today contains advice from a mentor to his beloved child in the faith. It offers of profile of how the baptized person is to live. It's a shame that the reading does not begin earlier (1 Timothy 6:9–10) and end later (6:17–19), because these verses directly warn about the dangers of money, offering advice for the wealthy so that they may "lay hold of eternal life" (6:12).

Living God's Word

Jesus became poor so that we might be rich in the grace and wisdom of the Lord. We can pray and meditate on the responsorial psalm for this week: "Blessed is he who keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets captives free" (Psalm 146:7).

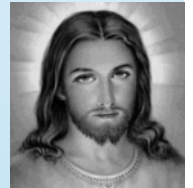

Reading the Manuals

I recently bought a brand new Toyota Prius car that came with not one but two manuals!! In all my years of owning cars, I can proudly say that I have never read the manual that came with the car. But I am forced to at least look through various sections of the manual since the car operates in ways unlike any car I have ever owned. I am slowly learning how much this car is capable of doing and the less I read the manual, the less my car will do. For example, I am finally learning that the car has the ability to give me directions to anywhere I wish to drive...something called a "GPS" system.

As human beings, we are no different than my Prius...there are unexplored areas of our lives: gifts, talents, desires and aspirations that we are unaware of because we have not "read the manual" of the Gospel, Church teachings, or the lives of the saints. These form a manual of living life that surface untapped geographies of the human heart. The car is designed to take us to places, involving not only our jobs but trips of adventure to unfamiliar places and cities.

Reading the manual of the Gospel and Church uncovers new territories within our hearts that compel us to want to build the kingdom of Jesus in ways that are creative and challenging. The unjust steward in the parable is not praised for his dishonesty but his ingenuity...his creative response to a difficult situation. Once he loses his job

he ingratiate himself into the lives of the debtors so they will "welcome me into their homes." And he proceeds to reduce what each debtor owes the owner of the land, who then commends this dishonest servant for "acting prudently." Only in this parable of Jesus do we have a totally dishonest and cheating person being held up in approval.

Jesus is looking at us right now and seeing all the untapped potential here...right here...in you and me. In failing to "read the manual" of our faith so that the words sink in and saturate our very hearts, we are not living up to the potential given to us by God. Jesus is saying to us that if we put as much energy into building up this parish community as we do into investing our

money in stock dividends and portfolios, supporting the beloved Bears, surfing the net, engaging in the latest technology...what a fantastic and vibrant community this could better become.

We have to make friends of the "children of this world" whose creativity in building up the world can be imitated. We can invest our very lives and the passion that comes with our talents into reaching out and building the world of the Kingdom...a way of life rooted in the Eucharist and prayer, as well as, the words of the Gospel. The investment of our money can help people who are poor or struggling economically; our technology of Facebook and Twitter and other forms of electronic media can be used to connect us with each other and spread the gospel.

Reading the manual of gospel and church and holy lives will take us on the greatest adventure possible: giving birth to God's Presence...the Kingdom...through our very gifts and passions. This adventure will engage us into the lives of countless numbers of people who wear the "face of God." Yes, we must become engaged in life by giving our own lives away. But we have to read the manual.
