

In Fr. Frank's words: "A beautiful moment as we watched our refugee family come through the doors after three hours in




Other ways to help refugees:

Treasures from Our Tradition

Once the early Christians realized that Christ's coming in glory was delayed, there was a need to provide for the governance and everyday needs of the church. The various "orders" within the church carried forward the apostles' ministry, but also allowed for a measure of creativity. The sacrament we call "holy orders" evolved somewhat slowly. At first, it made sense for Christians to use the forms they knew, adapting them to new situations. Synagogues, for example, were administered by a board of "elders," translated into Greek as *presbyteros*. We know from the

lated into Greek as *presbyteros*. We know from the Acts of the Apostles that a system of presbyters was a normal feature of church life from earliest days. They stood in relationship to another order, that of "overseers," translated into Greek as *episkopos*, giving us the English "bishops." The bishop was the shepherd, the faithful tender of the flock, one who offered the Eucharist, forgave sins, and maintained the bond of charity. Just as the deacons were the chief advisers for the charitable life of the church, so were the presbyters meant to advise the bishop on the spiritual life of the faithful. They were trusted advisers at first, not pastors or priests as we understand those terms today. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

hasta el octavo día. Según los peruanos los santos y vírgenes pasan las siete noches platicando con el Señor de los temblores, bromeando y planificando el año que viene para sus parroquias. El último día los santos y vírgenes regresan a sus santuarios con otra procesión.



Help by Walking

Join the St. Teresa Team on **Saturday**, **June 25th** at **Jackson Park** for an easy, family-friendly 5k stroll at Chicago's beautiful and historic Jackson Park in Hyde Park on the shores of Lake Michigan. The St. Teresa **team will meet at 8**

am at the Divvy Blue Bike Stand near the registration table close to where the walk starts (6300 Lake Shore Drive/East Hayes Drive). We will step off together at 8:30 am

If you are not able to walk but would like to come out and support the efforts of the team you can join the cheerleading section! Every registered walker counts toward our fund-raising total.

There is no charge to walk. St Teresa's Food Pantry gets a \$12 credit at the GCFD for every person we register and bring to the walk: from age zero to 100 -- age and mobility don't matter. For St Teresa to receive the food credit you must **register each member of your family/party at:** https://www.crowdrise.com/st-teresa-of-avila-food-pantry

This is easier to do this year and up to 10 people can be registered at one time. The website will indicate that there is a fee to walk but you need only add St Teresa's agency number (A01459) as the promotional code to have all 'fees' waived.

Getting There

Limited free parking is available in two lots – the first is close to the start of the walk - E. Hayes Drive and Lake Shore Drive, and the second is across Lake Shore Drive at the 63rd Street Beach lot. Both are a short walk to our team meeting point. We will hire a bus to get us there and back if there is interest. We would leave St. Teresa's parking lot at 7:00 am and return at 11:00 am after the Walk finishes.
