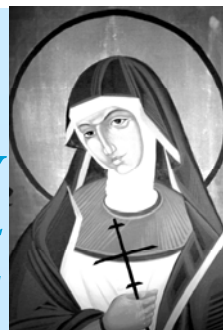

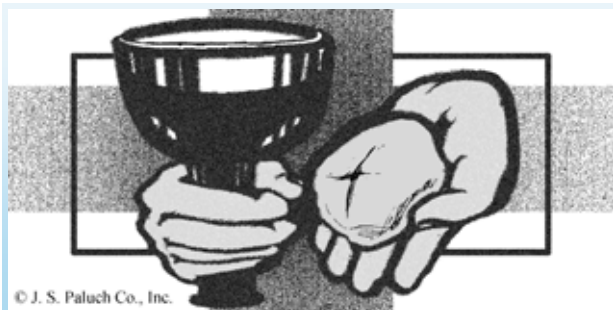
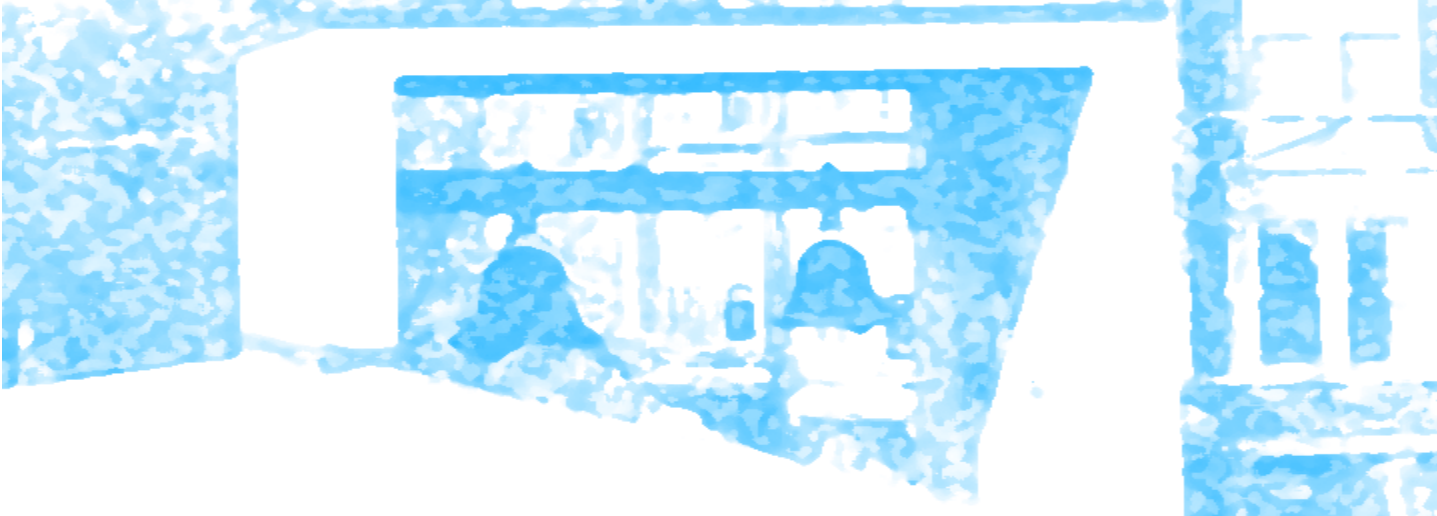

What a wonderful family: a mom and her son and daughter wanting a new life of hope and possibility. It was deeply moving. Please pray for them, as the God of Abraham unites us all in love. May we all find 'refuge' in this wonderful God of Peace and Joy."

Our donations assist with the cost of rent, furniture and basic necessities while the family transitions to the United States. Our volunteers will assist the family in learning English, navigating the city of Chicago and adapting to our culture.

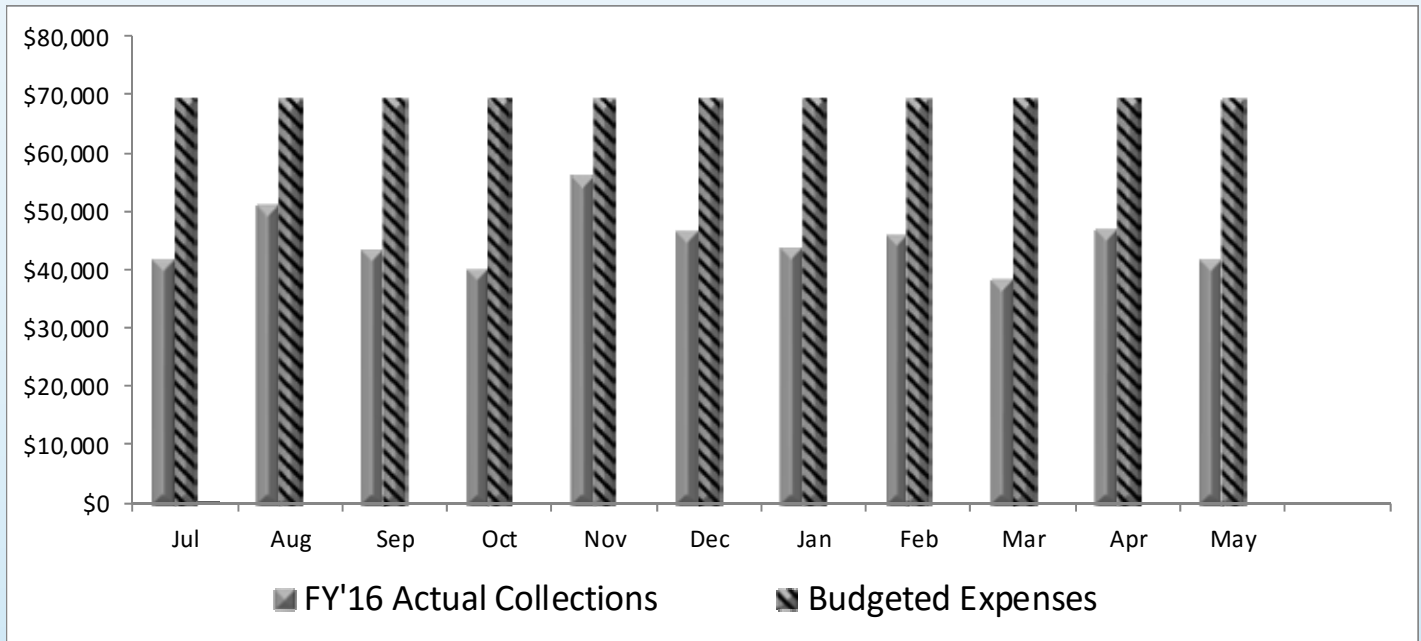

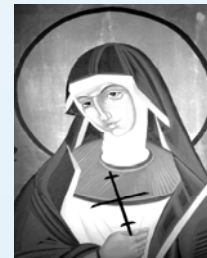

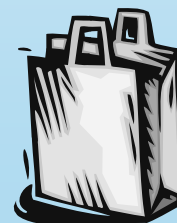

## Treasures from Our Tradition

Once the early Christians realized that Christ's coming in glory was delayed, there was a need to provide for the governance and everyday needs of the church. The various "orders" within the church carried forward the apostles' ministry, but also allowed for a measure of creativity. The sacrament we call "holy orders" evolved somewhat slowly. At first, it made sense for Christians to use the forms they knew, adapting them to new situations. Synagogues, for example, were administered by a board of "elders," translated into Greek as *presbyteros*. We know from the Acts of the Apostles that a system of presbyters was a normal feature of church life from earliest days. They stood in relationship to another order, that of "overseers," translated into Greek as *episkopos*, giving us the English "bishops." The bishop was the shepherd, the faithful tender of the flock, one who offered the Eucharist, forgave sins, and maintained the bond of charity. Just as the deacons were the chief advisers for the charitable life of the church, so were the presbyters meant to advise the bishop on the spiritual life of the faithful. They were trusted advisers at first, not pastors or priests as we understand those terms today. — Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.



## Tradiciones de Nuestra Fe

Perú tiene más de 3000 fiestas cada año, normalmente en torno al santo patrón de algún pueblo. La celebración de Corpus Christi es celebrada en todo el país. Pero es más llamativa en Cusco. Durante el día se escucha el repique de María Angola, la campana más grande de todo Perú, que existe desde el siglo XVI.

La celebración incluye una procesión con quince santos y vírgenes del siglo XVII, que vienen desde sus santuarios hasta la barroca Catedral de Cusco para honrar el Cuerpo de Jesús. Estas imágenes son cargadas por la plaza de armas antes de llegar a la catedral donde se quedarán hasta el octavo día. Según los peruanos los santos y vírgenes pasan las siete noches platicando con el Señor de los temblores, bromeando y planificando el año que viene para sus parroquias. El último día los santos y vírgenes regresan a sus santuarios con otra procesión.

Estas dos procesiones nos recuerdan que por mucho que los latinoamericanos amemos y veneremos a los santos y vírgenes reconocemos que tanto ellos como nosotros están al servicio de Cristo Jesús. — Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Glz, OFM, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

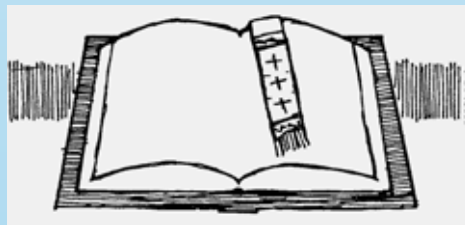

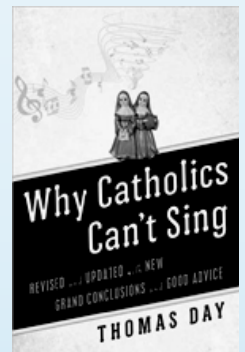

The 31<sup>st</sup> Greater Chicago Food Depository Hunger Walk is on Saturday June 25<sup>th</sup>. Your participation in last year's walk funded about half of our Food Pantry's operating costs for the year! Please lend your support again this year. Here is how you can help:

### Help by Donating

If you are not available on June 25th, you can be part of this team effort by making a donation. No amount is too small. All donations to the team come to us in full, and the Greater Chicago Food Depository (GCFD) will match 25% of the first \$5,000 we raise. ### Help by Walking

Join the St. Teresa Team on **Saturday, June 25th** at **Jackson Park** for an easy, family-friendly 5k stroll at Chicago's beautiful and historic Jackson Park in Hyde Park on the shores of Lake Michigan. The St. Teresa team will meet at **8 am** at the Divvy Blue Bike Stand near the registration table close to where the walk starts (6300 Lake Shore Drive/East Hayes Drive). We will step off together at 8:30 am

If you are not able to walk but would like to come out and support the efforts of the team you can join the cheerleading section! Every registered walker counts toward our fund-raising total.

There is no charge to walk. St Teresa's Food Pantry gets a \$12 credit at the GCFD for every person we register and bring to the walk: from age zero to 100 -- age and mobility don't matter. For St Teresa to receive the food credit you must **register each member of your family/party at:** <https://www.crowdrise.com/st-teresa-of-avila-food-pantry>

This is easier to do this year and up to 10 people can be registered at one time. The website will indicate that there is a fee to walk but you need only add St Teresa's agency number (**A01459**) as the promotional code to have all 'fees' waived.

### Getting There

Limited free parking is available in two lots -- the first is close to the start of the walk - E. Hayes Drive and Lake Shore Drive, and the second is across Lake Shore Drive at the 63<sup>rd</sup> Street Beach lot. Both are a short walk to our team meeting point. We will hire a bus to get us there and back if there is interest. We would leave St. Teresa's parking lot at 7:00 am and return at 11:00 am after the Walk finishes. **We need to have 37 confirmed bus riders by June 14<sup>th</sup>.** Please contact Mairead Reidy at [mairead.reidy@yahoo.com](mailto:mairead.reidy@yahoo.com) as soon as possible.
